PRAYING FOR OUR CHILDREN

My mother-in-law is 95 years old and is in the last stages of her life. She has Alzheimer's and doesn't remember very much or many people. However, she still has a prayer journal. On our last visit with her she asked Robert to come in her room. She had to ask him my name and the names of our children, and he could see that she was writing their names in a journal. She then asked Robert to write how she could pray for each of us, specific prayer concerns. And she told Robert she would pray for us every day. As we left, Robert and I realized the gift she has given to our family for all these years. She has prayed for Robert every day of his life. She has prayed for me since the first time she met me (she said she knew I was the one for Robert the first time we met.) And has prayed for Chelsea and Chase every day of their life. Prayer for her family will be her legacy. She is truly a prayer warrior.

I have begun to think about life without those daily prayers when she leaves this earth. Who will pray for all of us each day? So, I have started a new prayer life that includes deeper prayers for my family. As a mom of two grown children, I really don't regret much but I did let busyness and life get in the way of serious prayer for my kids at times. Maybe knowing others were doing it. And many times, when I prayed for them, it was more of a laundry list of things like

help Chelsea with her volleyball tryouts, or help Chase remember to turn in his homework. Rarely did my prayers get more creative than that.

I discovered a book by Jodi Berndt that has challenged me to use the Bible itself, God's actual words as the foundation for our prayers. "If you remain in me and my words remian in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be given to you." Here is an example take a verse like Ephesians 4:32. "Be Kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgives you."

I pray that Chelsea and Chase would be kind and compassionate toward the people in their life, forgiving others when they feel hurt or betrayed just as Christ God has forgiven them.

Prayers like these coming from God's Word carry the full weight and power of God's Word. So, let's get started and begin October on a new prayer journey and remember, when we pray for our children, we join God in the work He is already doing in their lives.
